Aims and learning outcomes of the course

Courses based on this specification should enable students to:

- read a wide range of texts, fluently and with good understanding
- read critically, and use knowledge gained from wide reading to inform and improve their own writing
- write effectively and coherently using Standard English appropriately
- use grammar correctly, punctuate and spell accurately
- acquire and apply a wide vocabulary, alongside a knowledge and understanding of grammatical terminology, and linguistic conventions for reading, writing and spoken language.

In addition, they must enable students to:

listen to and understand spoken language, and use spoken Standard English effectively.

Course Content

GCSE English Language Course Overview

Two components to each exam.

Each paper is split into Section A (reading) and Section B (writing).

Paper 1 – 50% of qualification (1 hour and 45 minutes)

Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing.

Section A – Reading (25%)

One literature fiction text assessed through four questions.

Section B – Writing (25%)

Descriptive or narrative writing.

Paper 2 – 50% of qualification (1 hour and 45 minutes)

Writer's viewpoints and Perspectives.

Section A – Reading (25%)

One non-fiction text and one literary non-fiction text assessed through four questions.

Section B – Writing (25%)

One writing task to present a viewpoint.

Spoken Language – formal presentation or speech.

Achievement in Spoken Language will be reported as part of the qualification, but will not form part of the final mark or grade.

Qualifications Purpose

The Pearson Edexcel Functional Skills Qualification in English at Level 1 and 2 are for learners to develop understanding and skills in English.

- Write texts of varying complexity, with accuracy, effectiveness, and correct spelling, punctuation and grammar
- Understand the situations when, and audiences for which, planning, drafting.

Speaking, listening and communicating is assessed through one 3-minute talk and linked question and answer session per	10-20 minutes in total	n/a
learner in groups of three to four and one 10-minute formal discussion together in groups of three to five learners.	10 minutes	
Reading is assessed through a test comprised of controlled response and open response questions.	60 minutes	30
Writing is assessed through a test comprised of two tasks. (42% of marks assesses spelling, punctuation and grammar)	60 minutes	36
