The Governors, staff and students are seeking to appoint an enthusiastic, dedicated and highly motivated teacher to join our lovely school. This is an exciting opportunity to be part of a team which is expanding the existing specialist provision within the school. The successful candidate will be working with students at Key Stage 3 but working at KS2 academic level and therefore we would welcome primary colleagues to apply.

- Has a history of excellent classroom practice
- Ideally has ASD/SEND specific experience
- Awareness of (and ability to implement) Speech and Language programs would be helpful
- Has experience of managing support staff and maintaining and developing close partnerships with parents, carers and external agencies
- Has the ability to implement EHCPs
- Has supported pupils with a wide range of needs and can demonstrate the positive impact their teaching has had on these pupils
- Can adapt and respond to the varying needs and challenges children with ASD can sometimes display.
- Has a clear and up to date understanding of the SEND code of practice, safeguarding and equalities issues
- Will contribute to the wider strategic direction of the school and promote positive behaviour across the school
- Has high expectations of what children can achieve
- Is willing to take a full part in the life of the school
